1. DISCUSSION/ACTION

Title: Townhall

This item is to discuss holding another Townhall, and details related to its planning, focus, etc.

Presenter: All

Time: 20 minutes

- Kim wants to establish specific roles to execs to plan
- Katelyn wants more general
 - so does Lloyd
- Sunnie spoke about foothills monthly and latest one was on basic needs
- Iris wants it to be focused on anti-racist work
 - didn't issue a statement or did any work tackling rise of racism specifically to Black/AA and Asian students
 - beginning-mid May
- Lianna spoke about including deans in a general town hall to get more direct answers
- Kaitlyn wondered if we could do both, add a section specific to anti-racism work
- Kim advocates for both as well but is unsure about capacity for senate
 - mentions this is something SF could lead
- Iris wonders if changing structure
- Kim mentions next quarter there will be a series of panels, specifically different ethnics group each week and is concerned we will be duplicating something that is being done
 - believes panels will be very targeted work
- Beniam mentioned working with Esha on fighting anti-blackness panel and started reaching out to people (!)
 - keep it to what topics for that day, who would be best or almost best to speak that day
- Lianna suggested first one 6 weeks into the quarter and then second one a month later
- Kim suggests soon like last week of april and also collaborating with new senate
- Grace suggests planning over meeting
- Iris clarifies 1st at end of April and 2nd at end of May
 - want to address black students and asian students so how would we split that up?
- Sunnie suggests extending into the blanket idea of racial justice and extending it to as many people
- Lianna/Kim breakout rooms for either/any group
 - psych services, brainstorm rooms
- Kim talk about how covid has impacted minority groups to specifically address those things and what they want from college/DASB
- Esha does not like the breakout rooms because doesnt want students to have to choose academic, psych, racial, and social justice concerns,
 - doesn't want to force kids to choose
- Hyon Chu suggests collaboration with office of equity, more in terms of logistical set up
 - need folks skilled at facilitating these kinds of conversations

- Iris, Kirana, and Kaitlyn all against breakout rooms because all are connected, would still force people to choose, and a little segregation-ish
- Hyon Chu asks are we calling this a townhall because usually thats just for people to come into one place, not like a conference
- Iris suggested breaking into segments and allocating time for each like 3 different days
- Beniam suggest (i think) not splitting but more centered around racial justice aspect and specific asks of DAC/DASB
- Finalized 2 separate; one for addressing racism and one for general concerns
 - still need to decide who will be hearing the concerns/asks
 - affinity groups
 - moderators/facilitators like dawn lee tu
 - or ourselves
- more planning to come
