The following requirements must be met for the Flint Center community benefit initiative process to be considered inclusive of student needs:

- 1. The establishment of a committee of multiple students, faculty, and staff to oversee the process of deciding what will replace the Flint Center.
- 2. A published and distributed calendar of engagement opportunities for multiple groups of students in various forms over the course of the next year.
- 3. Student needs, both current and projected, will be factored into the decision making processes in clear and quantifiable ways.
- 4. Weighing mechanisms and priorities for the final decision must be clearly communicated—i.e., to what extent is final decision made based on investor return, etc.
- 5. Students must be included in all meetings where decisions are made.
- 6. All materials, including financials and investor information, shall be shared with the committee.
- 7. There shall be communication in advance of engagement opportunities, with informational materials disseminated to students through instructors, DASB, the Office of Equity and the Communications Office.
