What significant changes have occured since the last complete program review? Were those changes based on SLO assessments? How have these changes affected your program? The most significant change since the last program review has been fewer offerings and more enrollments. Our classes are popular, transferable, satisfy GE requirements and in great demand. Due to budgetary constraints we have fewer offerings in the evening and afternoon. We are also limited to offering only 1 lab class (because of availability of space in Biology) even though it fills within the first two weeks. We are working with the MLC team to get a well equipped and functional lab and exhibit space in which we can then hold lab classes and forensics and museum studies class. On a positive note, we as a department are participating in CAR, working committedly to achieving equity, and participating in SLO assessments, discussion and reevaluations. Both CAR and SLO discussions are critical in reassessing our course objectives and teaching pedagogy.

A preliminary SLOAC was done for Anth 1 and 2 in winter 2010, a more thorough one will be completed by the end of this quarter (Spring 2010). One of the SLO for Anth 2 was assessed via multiple choice questions in a mid term examination. The results showed that about 39-48% of the students in the two sections demonstrated understanding of cultural relativism and ethnocentrism. A more thorough analysis using other types of assignments (papers, discussion exercises and presentations) are being currently completed during this quarter.
