- 1) The [11/28/22 CCCCC memo](#) required a response from the college re: offering MATH114 to only those students with an ed goal of certificate or AA/AS from De Anza.
 - a. (Merhdad & Casie) The Math department and Assessment will draft a response to the 11/28/22 CCCCC memo outlining action items that the department has implemented to include
 - i. MATH114 – prereq statements in catalog/schedule to be updated by Fall 2022
 - ii. Reviewing and updating placement language to note that MATH114 is not required for transfer ed goals
 - b. The group discussed that advising for MATH114 had implications on articulation, catalog, schedule, etc.
 - c. Additional recommendations for improvement for MATH114 messaging included
 - i. Footnote information for math114 to model ewrt1a+lart250
 - ii. Partnering with Guided Pathways
- 2) The AB 1705 memo was briefly reviewed
 - a. The group highlighted the reference to granting students credit for courses completed in high school courses and by credit for prior learning
 - b. Discussion about AP exam scores and possible action items by departments – how to make changes? Course outline from departments?
 - c. The CCCCC said they would issue an AB 1705 implementation guide soon
- 3) Department updates
 - a. The ESL Department plans to launch their ESL Guided Self-Placement (GSP) assessment in mid to late April.

- i. The ESL GSP will replace the ESL writing test.
- ii. The Assessment Center will continue to manage the ESL GSP assessment (edits to content, granting and monitoring access, manually entering student results)
- iii. The estimated ESL GSP results timeline—entry and student notification--will be 1-3 business day (like it is for Math, English and science exam results).
