

# **Local Peer Online Course Review Process**

The Local Peer Online Course Review (POCR) was established in 2014 by the CVC-OEI Professional Development Workgroup to ensure that students in the California Community College system have access to high-quality online courses designed to support student learning and success. This process is voluntary and separate from department instructional evaluations.





Once aligned, courses will receive a "quality-reviewed" badge that is visible in the student search for courses in the California Community College Online Course Exchange. (cvc.edu) Badged courses rise to the top of the list for courses that have empty seats.

## **Goals and Benefits**

- 1. Serve as a positive professional development experience for new and experienced online faculty.
- 2. Lead to more engaging and satisfactory online experiences for both instructors and students.
  - 2022 study by Chaffey College (PDF) revealed a 14% increase in course success rates after POCR alignment.
- 3. Improve success, retention, and equity outcomes by developing quality online courses.
- 4. Result in OEI-Rubric aligned, "Quality Reviewed" course badging from De Anza College in the CVC Exchange.

## **POCR Team**

The POCR Team will be comprised of the POCR Lead, Instructional Designers, and trained faculty reviewers who have completed the free @ONE POCR Course. Faculty will receive mentor support from the POCR Team in the areas of Content Presentation/Navigation, Accessibility, Substantive Interactions (RSI), Continuous Improvement Strategies, and Assessments

#### **Local POCR Process**

#### Step 1: Prepare and Align: Getting POCR Ready

Faculty will meet with the POCR team (POCR Lead and Instructional Designers) for an introductory meeting to explain the Quality Course Rubric and process, conduct a course self-review and alignment check including Accessibility. (Sandbox Shell instead of a live Canvas course.)

### **Step 2: Apply for Completing the POCR Process**

Complete and submit the application (De Anza Online Education Center/COOL).

## **Step 3: POCR Mentor Review**

POCR trained and certified faculty mentor faculty using the Quality Course Design Rubric (including Accessibility) and provide feedback, recommendations and support for alignment.

# Step 4: Faculty Updates/Revision

Faculty member implements team feedback, recommendations, and comments including Accessibility.

#### **Step 5: POCR Completion**

POCR Team completes a final check of the recommended changes implemented by the faculty member.

Step 6: POCR Certified: CVC Quality Badging



Local POCR Lead provides the course and faculty information to CVC for Quality Badging on the CVC Course Exchange.
