SUBJECT: Nursing Program Theory Survey, Winter 2014

A survey was sent by Nursing Program faculty to students of De Anza College enrolled in the Nursing Program during Winter quarter 2014. A total of 178 students responded to the online survey.

Important highlights include:

- 99% of respondents “agree” or “strongly agree” that the assigned reading and AVs for the course were appropriate.
- 98% of respondents “agree” or “strongly agree” that the out-of-class suggested reading and AV assignments were accessible.
- 97% of respondents “agree” or “strongly agree” that the complexity of the course was appropriate for this level.
- 95% of respondents “agree” or “strongly agree” that the objectives of the course were obtainable; the out-of-class assignments (eg AV, group activities, etc) were relevant to the course objectives; the tests (quizzes, etc) in the course related to the course objectives; and the course has helped them to improve in clinical performance.
- 94% of respondents “agree” or “strongly agree” that the course objectives were clear and the topics covered in exams and assignments for this course were consistent with the course objectives.
- 93% of respondents “agree” or “strongly agree” that the assigned papers for this course contributed to the achievement of course objectives.
- 92% of respondents “agree” or “strongly agree” that the required textbook for this course was helpful for meeting the objectives.
- 90% of respondents “agree” or “strongly agree” that the lectures/demonstrations in the course were appropriate and that class time allowed for discussion and questions when appropriate.
