November 15, 2021

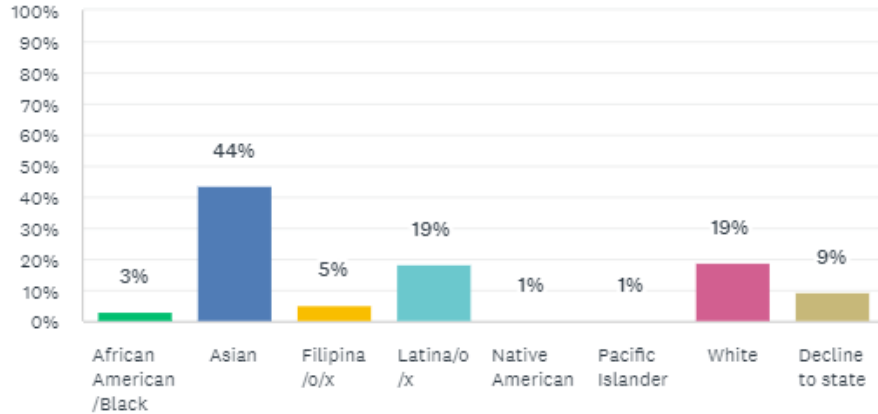
Survey Administration

- Sent to 16,584 students with a valid email address
- Administered October 25 – November 5, via initial and reminder emails, personalized by students' first names
- Approximately 3-minute survey; branched by response

1,919 responses for a 12% response rate



With which ethnicity do you most identify?



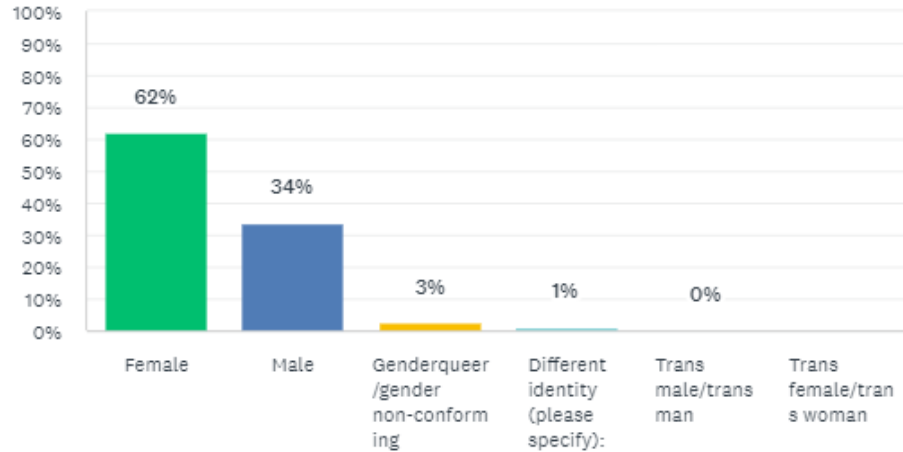

What is your current gender identity?

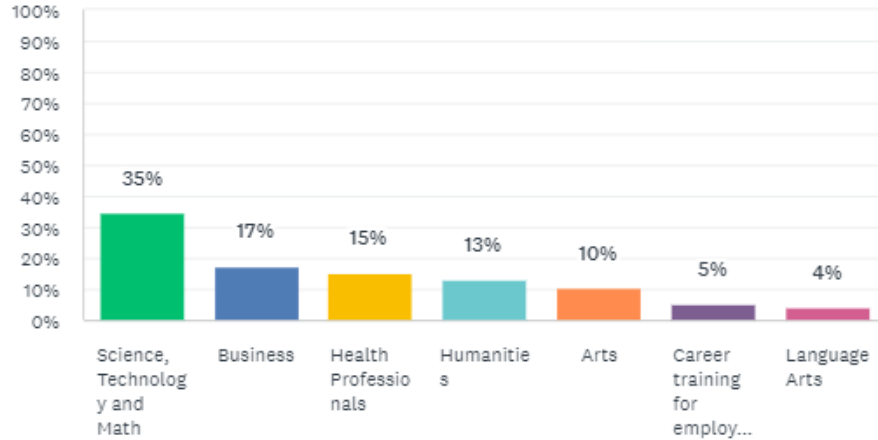

Which department most closely aligns with your major?



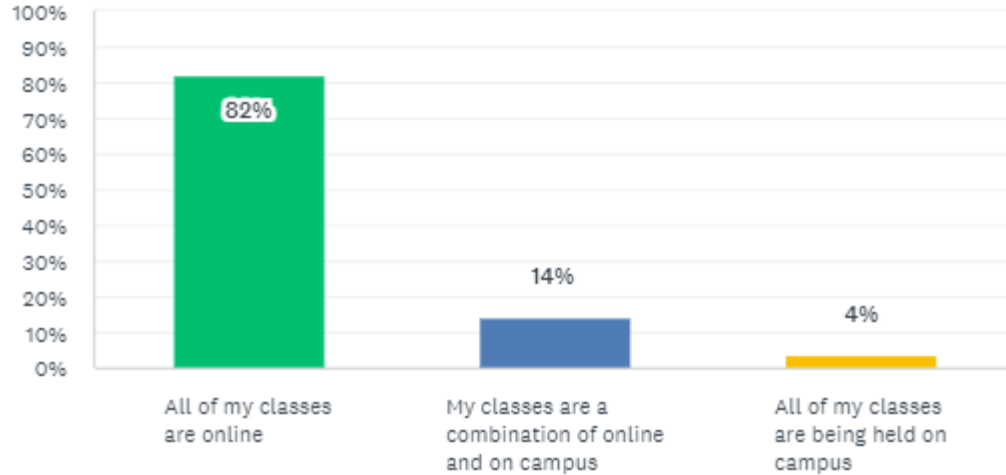

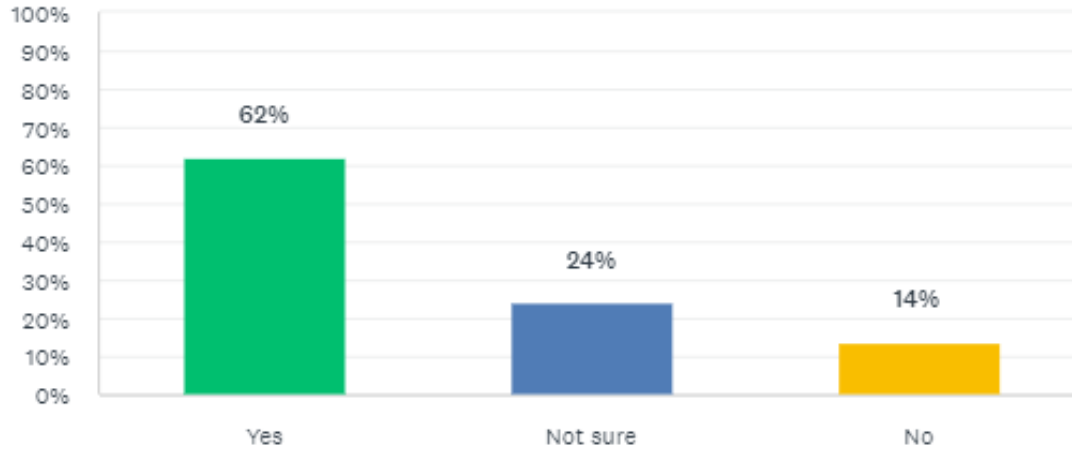
Which describes the classes you are taking for fall quarter 2021?

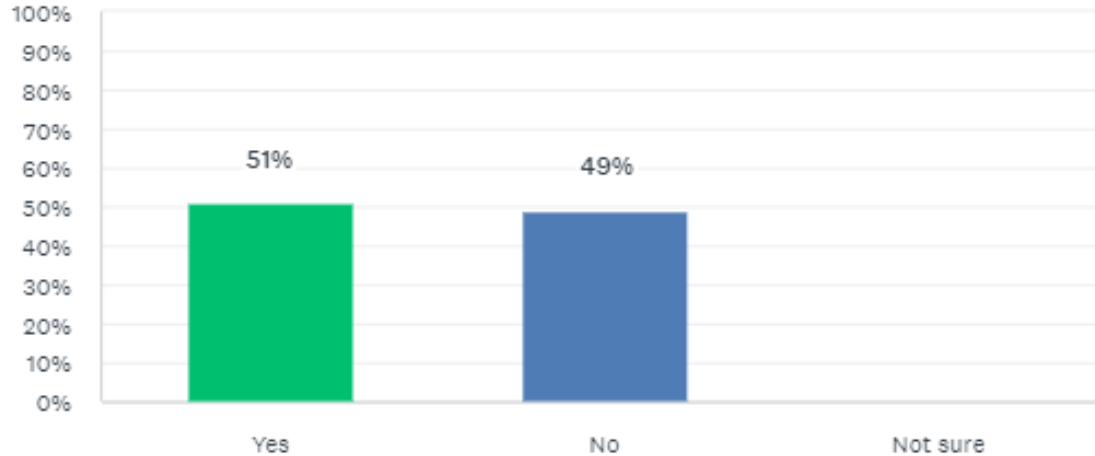

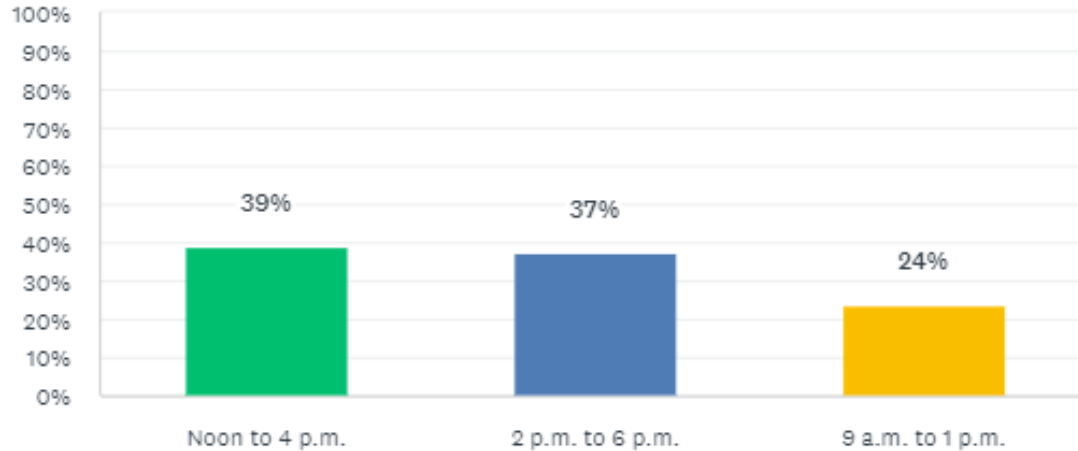
Which days would you most likely study at the Library?

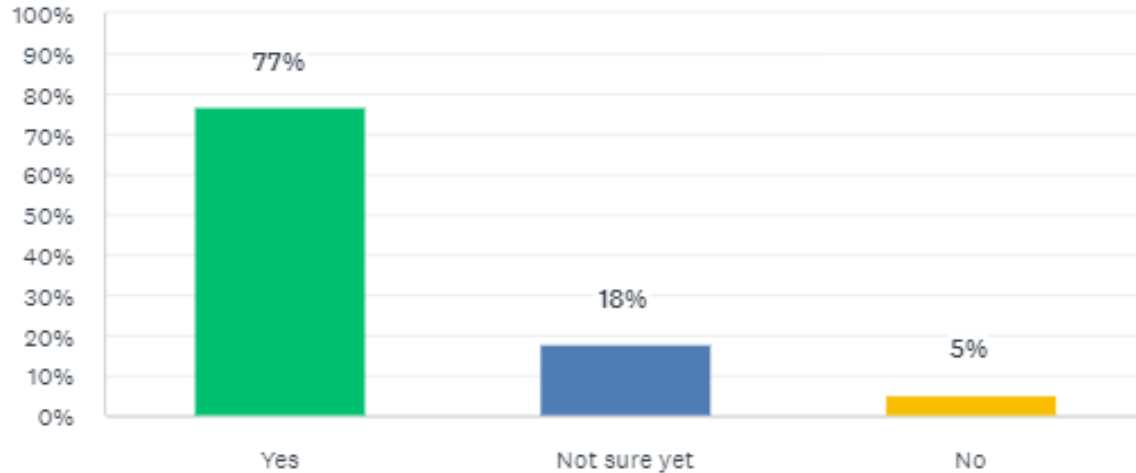

- 24% 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

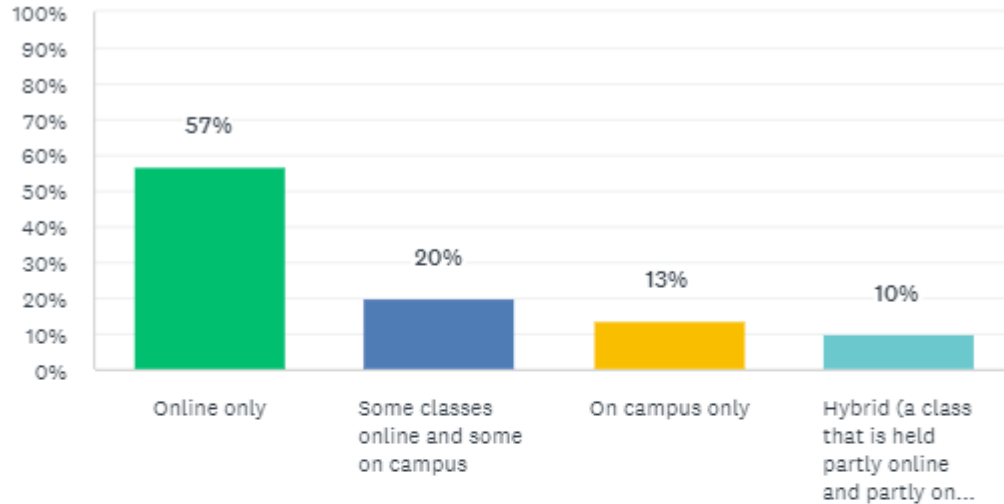
Do you plan to return to De Anza College in the winter or spring quarters?

If you had only one option, what kind of class would you most prefer to take this winter and spring quarter?

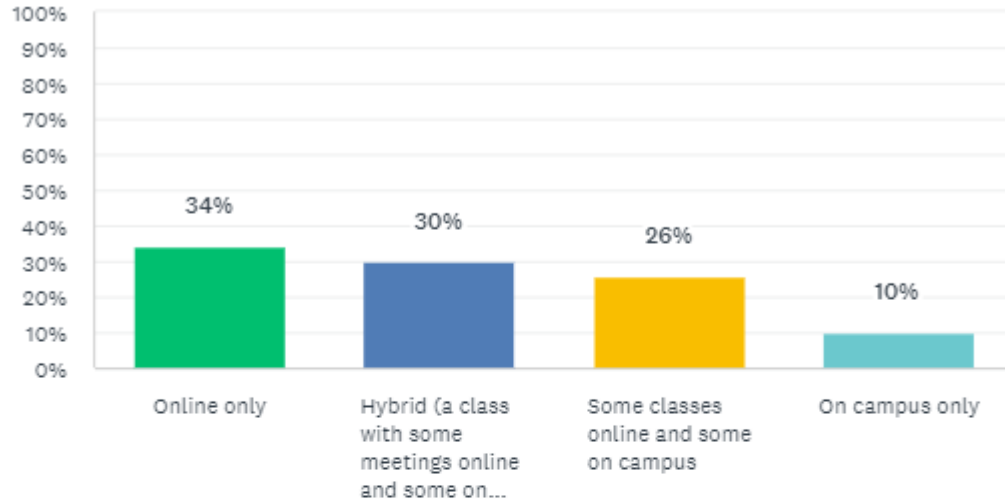

If you had a second option, what kind of class would be your next choice to take this winter and spring quarter?

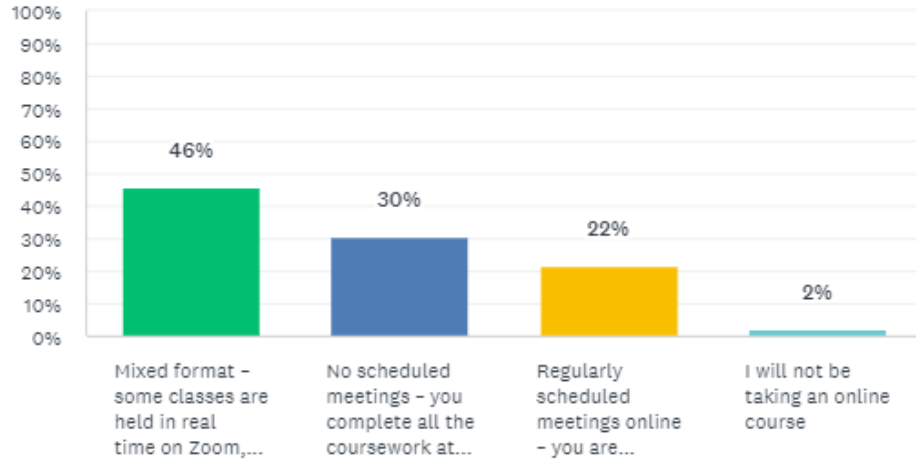

▼ Mixed format - some classes are held in real time on Zoom, but attendance is voluntary, and coursework can be completed at your own pace. (Instructors may record meetings for you to view on your own time.)	46% 691
▼ No scheduled meetings - you complete all the coursework at your own pace, within the assigned dates	30% 459
▼ Regularly scheduled meetings online - you are required to attend classes on Zoom in real time	22% 327
▼ I will not be taking an online course	2% 30

- **46% - Mixed Format - with some classes held in real time on Zoom, but attendance is voluntary, and coursework can be completed at your own pace, within assigned dates**
- **30% - No Scheduled Meetings – you complete all the coursework at your own pace, within the assigned dates**
- **22% - Regularly Scheduled Meetings Online – you are required to attend classes on Zoom in real time**

- **49% indicated a preference for Science courses with labs to take on campus**
- **33% indicated Arts (e.g., Dance, Theater, Music)**
- **31% indicated Math**
- **27% indicated Kinesiology**

Over the past 12 months, how much would you say each area affected your ability to be successful at De Anza?

Respondents who indicated the following areas had some effect or a great effect on their success include:

- **Pandemic and Shelter in Place** – including lack of a quiet place to study or attend class, loss of interaction with others, increased stress, etc. (66%, n = 856)
- **Mental Health Issues** – personal or family mental health issues or lack of access to mental health services (56%, n = 676)
- **Lack of Finances** – not enough money or financial aid to pay for college and associated expenses (44%, n = 493)
- **Unemployment or Underemployment** – loss of employment or inability to find employment when seeking it or not enough hours to pay to support your financial needs (39%, n = 437)
