A presentation must reflect the topics either currently presented in class or in the last week. You must show me your work before presenting. Once I see your work I will give you a choice of days to present. No one may be able to present in the week before finals so do not wait too long. There will be at most 2 presentations per class meeting.

Labs: Three to five collaborative statistics labs will be assigned. Labs will be described in class. Unless given permission, lab projects must be done in groups of 2. If you turn in a lab by yourself (without a lab partner) you will be deducted by 20%. NO LATE labs will be accepted

Exams: Three exams worth one hundred and fifty points each will be given. If you have an extenuating circumstance you must provide evidence of the situation and contact me asap. It will be my decision to give you a makeup or not. An extenuating circumstance is not a flight out/in from vacation, picking someone up from the airport, scheduled an interview ect...

Final Exam: A comprehensive exam will be given. If you miss the exam without contacting me before the exam you will automatically get 0% on the final.
