Homework

Homework problems are assigned in the homework sheet. It is very important for you to do all of your assignments in a timely manner and <u>follow the required format</u>.

- 1. **The cover sheet (mandatory to get hw graded)** has your name (top right), the chapter, three columns listing sections, total assigned problems, and total problems completed.
- 2. Start each section on a fresh sheet and has a labeled tab. Highlight or box the section number at the middle top. Write the assigned problems on the first line.
- 3. Problems are done in increasing order and start at left margin with answer are in boxes or been highlighted.
- 4. Draw a line across the page when finishing a problem.
- 5. Bind your hw pages, at least with top left stapled, in the increasing order of sections, review (same order on the cover sheet as well).

Homework and the cover page is checked every class for completeness. Your homework is graded on neatness, completeness, and correctness on some random problems. Therefore, in the Q&A time at the beginning of each section (for at most 10 min long), write your question number(s) on the board (left most). If you know the solution to any of the problems on the board, then please share yours on the board and get 1 point extra credit. No late homework is accepted. *Review* and pretest (given by the instructor, not from the book) are parts of the homework grade (follow homework format above). Bind it after the last section of the homework, with a labeled tab.

Homework and the Review of each chapter are collected on the chapter test day, before the test given out. No late work is accepted.

Quizzes:

There are 7 quizzes total. I will drop the lowest one. So, 6 quizzes are at 2 % each for the total of 12%. There will be no make-ups for missed quizzes.

Tests:
