

# TASK FORCE BACKGROUND

# Program givens

On a meeting with President Holmes on May 26, 2023, the Task Force determined that these are the things that MUST

#### happen for the Measure G masterplan:

- Emphasized the importance of this project as a reset, and to forgo all previous plannings.
- Flint Center must be demolished.
- Events space larger than Conference room A+B is needed.
- Putting the needs of students first, and then the larger community be able to use the space after students.


# Identified program goals

These are the identified goals that the task force has evaluated:

- No disruptions to L Quad classes.
- No large capacity theatre like Flint.
- Updates to Student Services + Events Center.
- 4 Minimal swing spaces for A Quad.

\*This \$87M is at risk of being reallocated by the District. The Task Force is recommending it be used for Creative Arts and student focused events space in the Flint footprint.

# Walking Notes and Discussions

#### **VPAC**

- Dance students expressed the need of an indoor dance studio available for club use.
- o Musical instruments are damaged every time they are moved from A3 for a concert. Student labor is needed for each move.
- Expanding the VPAC in the direction of the parking lot expansion is possible since there is a fire road between VPAC and MCC.

#### **RSS**

- Services could be rearranged within the building.
- o Psychological Services should be moved because of concerns about student privacy and the need for proximity to Health Services.

#### **Campus Center**

- Health Services needs to be moved; multiple nurses currently share the same office; A FERPA concern for patients' privacy.
- Office of College Life needs new office space.
- Building getting old, with repairs needed consistently and constant uninviting odor is emitted throughout the entire campus center
- Need for a space for students to congregate aside from the cafeteria area such as the creation of a Student Union

#### **Sunken Garden Fountain**

- Removal of fountain as its currently unfunctional and cannot be fixed.
- Potential for an "open air" event space in place of fountain.

#### **A-Quad**

- Classrooms don't have enough room for the increased enrollment.
- Lab areas need updating and the ability to accommodate new technology.
- There is no Photography studio. Classroom furniture needs to be displaced as a temporary and inadequate solution every class session.
- There are ADA accessibility issues in many buildings of A Quad.

## **Creative Arts Needs**

#### Takeaways:

- Creative Arts currently contains 9
  main programs, with those
  programs & support spread across
  12 buildings.
- An updated, consolidated Creative
   Arts space is needed to facilitate
   interdisciplinary collaboration and
   better serve student needs.
- Facility Master Plan and Program
  Review data estimate 50,000
  square feet is needed to
  appropriately fit Creative Art's
  growing needs.



## **Creative Arts Needs**

#### **Specific Program Needs:**

- 1. (1) Music: Modernized spaces consolidated into a single building rather than 3 to improve instruction and student access.
- 2. (1) Ceramics: Larger classrooms to meet demand. Consolidate kiln technology in new, sustainable, better-designed spaces.
- 3. (1) Photography: Needs a studio to meet the minimum standards of the discipline.
- 4. (1) Sculpture: Space to implement new curriculum and technology.
- 5. (4) Graphic and Interactive Design: Room to meet demand and apply state-of-the-art technology.
- 6. (4) Film and Television: Modernize and expand the current inefficient and limited instructional space.
- 7. Dance: Students and dance clubs need safe, accessible spaces for practice.
- 8. (3) Art History: Larger, functional space to increase resource accessibility and usability for faculty and students.
- 9. (6) Artistic Expression Village: Move to the CA building to encourage student use of the Pathways resources.



# **Revamping Services for Students**

#### Takeaways:

- Many groups have outgrown their space.
- Current Student Services have difficult to find locations for students and first-time visitors.
- Consolidations of services will allow better coordination and continuous communication between programs to increase efficiency.
- Will streamline access and related services for students to increase student retention and success.



## Services for Students Needs

#### **Specific Program Needs:**

- (2) Psychological Services: The current location within RSS and the lobby is inaccessible for emergency services and crisis management.
- (5) Health Services: Space is inadequate, violates FERPA's expectation of privacy, and does not allow for efficient staff functionality.
- (5) EOPS: Inadequate and public space leads to increased stigmatization of marginalized populations.
- (5) DASG and College Life: Poor ventilation, inadequate light, and inaccessible location make it a non-functional space.
- (7) Pride Center: The space is inadequate, and its location makes it hard to engage with campus community.
- (8) Learning Communities: Needs to be centrally located to facilitate support and collaboration with other programs focused on marginalized populations.


