3. Select at least five skill areas in which each health technology team member should be proficient.
4. Differentiate between administrative and clinical responsibilities of the health technology team member.
5. State the sources of training available for health technology team members and advantages and disadvantages of each.
6. Analyze the rewards of a career as a health technology team member.
7. Develop various methods of coping with loss.
8. Describe the specialties and specialists in various medical specialties.
9. Recognize alternative perspectives of the delivery of health care with regard to gender, persons of different cultural backgrounds and those with disabilities.

- What does this employee enjoy about their job?
- Would they recommend this job?

Please type up this interview (minimum of 3 pages double spaced, no handwritten, no later than July 29th,2020).
