Course Statement: Fundamentals of Oral Communication is a course which provides an introduction to the theory, basic principles, and methods of oral communication, with emphasis on improved speaking and listening skills. The readings and class activities will provide both theoretical and practical considerations of the behaviors which facilitate or block successful attempts at communication in a broad range of situations from interpersonal, small group and or public communication. The class will provide a setting in which to examine and test some basic principles in oral communication to see what works and does not work when you are "one on one" with another person, or working in a small group, or offering a speech to an audience. Students are expected to participate in the classroom lectures, activities and be prepared to work in the class.

Course policies, which are strictly enforced:

- Attend the zoom meetings on time the link is on the left -- and pay attention, listen and take
 notes. This will help prepare you for the final exam. All meetings are recorded. Recordings will
 be available later in the Canvas Discussions.
- 2. Check CANVAS online for *due dates*, weekly messages (such as Announcements), assignments, *quizzes* or resources.
- 3. Read assigned chapters before each class and see the attendant slides.
- 4. All due dates are firm. Be aware of due dates and use the calendar to organize the course assignments.

5. Live Extemporaneous speeches during scheduled Zoom meetings. Sign ups on Canvas Discussions.

Student Learning Outcomes

This outcome includes abilities designed to help students

- Identify the role oral communication plays in academic, social, and professional endeavors.
- Demonstrate increased confidence in oral communication skills.
- Listen carefully and respond to questions appropriately.
- Modify verbal and nonverbal communication appropriately given the purpose and the context of the communication.
- Plan, prepare, and deliver a well-organized, logical oral presentation that demonstrates critical thinking skills.
- Use appropriate presentation techniques (e.g. maintain eye contact, modulate voice, avoid distracting mannerisms, etc.).
- Employ appropriate discussion, negotiation, conflict resolution, and cooperation skills to work
 with people from a variety of experiences and backgrounds to promote learning in class
 activities and group work.
- Learn by example-- this professor shall have example speeches throughout the course, demonstrating various models and topics of speech.

Evaluation and Grades

Canvas Online activities, participation, quizzes and assignments (20%)

Group activities, speeches and Final Exam (80%)

- Speech of Introduction (50 points): Creating a video speech (3-6 minutes long), following the outline format provided and modeled in class, we can all introduce ourselves to our classmates. Post the video link to our Discussion.
- Story time (100 points): find a published story from history, science, folklore, myth or legend, etc. and present it to the class. This is a narrative presentation. Requirements: 4 6 minutes long. Follow the outline format or narrate the tale for the main body. Post the video link to our Discussion.
- Impromptu speech (150 points): this is a 3-5 minute long speech, with only 5 minutes of
 preparation, and reflects a speakers' ability to spontaneously speak about a simple topic.
 Impromptu speaking is the most common form of verbal communication. Post the video link to

our Discussion.

- Informative Speech Live (200 points): this is a 8 -12 minute long speech that informs the audience about a personally chosen topic in depth and is objective in nature (present the issue from both sides) and is full of lively visual aids. Again, provide research and verbal source citations to support your claims. Biographies, demonstrations, narratives are all types of informative speeches. Possible topics include: electric vehicles, corporal punishment, musical artists, how to bake a cake, or the best beaches in the world. Post the video link to our Discussion.
- Symposium/group presentation LIVE (200 points): this will be a group effort and requires sharp
 organization and smooth transitions between speakers. Each group speaker has a 4-6 minute
 speaking burden. Provide research and verbal source citations to support your claims. This
 assignment is an exercise in small group communication, reflective of the modern business
 environment. Groups will be formed in week 3. Post the video link to our Discussion.

Presentation aids such as prezi.com, Loom.com, MS Powerpoint, Google slides and documents are recommended.

Speech due dates are listed on our Canvas site. Although not required, smart speakers should be dressed professionally, because remember, appearance matters!

Speeches are graded on organization (outline structure), substance (research and verbal source citation) and delivery (body language and voice). See the critique form available on Canvas Files.

Speech critiques will be required of all students – a typed, 1 full page letter for the speaker during the Informative speech. Use the critique sheet in Canvas Files to help evaluate your speaker and their speech. See the Assignment for specifics. Find an Informative Speech to evaluate in our Discussion: Informative Speeches.

Final Exam (150 points): will cover all the textbook and Zoom meeting lecture materials. The Canvas exam will be short answer, multiple choice, T/F, matching questions, and diagrams. It is an open note and open book final exam, so prepare accordingly.

Online quizzes, discussions (replies, comments, etc.) and *Canvas* material are part of your online participation grade/aka imported assignments (20%). In the Discussions, there are discussion threads where you can add your speech topics, videos and leave comments. Specifically, there is a Canvas Participation assignment worth 150 Points, which is determined by your online participation on Canvas Discussions. You can comment, watch classmates' videos, leave links and research, and keep it polite and supportive. This score is determined at the end of the course.
