This class will help you improve your English essay writing, reading and vocabulary skills so that you can be more successful in university, work, and your personal life. We will learn together using Canvas, Zoom, online discussions, and an online workbook. We will read professional essays, a novel and write academic style essays. I will be available on Zoom for any help that you need!

ESL 5 is **transferable to the California State University** (Area A2-Written Communication) and meets the General Education requirement for **AA and AS degrees** (Area A1-English Composition). It will be **transferable to the University of California** (IGETC Area A1-English Composition) beginning in fall Quarter 2021.

- Write essays, including research-based writing, demonstrating academic rhetorical strategies and documentation.

Zoom Class Meetings

We will meet online using Zoom, an online video conferencing platform. We will meet every Tuesday, 9:30-11:45. Please join our Zoom classes on time. If you must miss a class, please check the Announcements in Canvas for the homework.

To log in to our Zoom classes, just open Canvas and click on Zoom in red in the left menu. Then you will see a scheduled meeting and just click on the link.

You don't need a Zoom account, but I have been told that a Zoom account might be helpful. You can get a free Zoom account at Zoom.us.

Here is the technology you need for our Zoom class meetings:

- 1. A desktop computer or laptop.
- 2. It must have a **camera** and **microphone** that work.
- 3. It must be connected to the **internet**. WiFi is okay if it works well.

Independent Self-Study

This class is 5 units, which means 4.5 hours of "class time" a week. We will meet on Zoom for 2.25 hours every week. For the other 2.25 hours of "class time," you will work in your online workbook and online discussions. In addition, you will have the usual reading and writing homework.

In-Class Discussions

We will discuss the material we are studying in our Zoom classes. If you are prepared (that means you have done your homework), the class discussions will be more fun and productive. The in-class discussions will also be worth 10 points which is 10% of your final grade. So, it will be easy to get those points if you come to class prepared and speak up in class and in your groups.

Writing and Reading Center (WRC)

The <u>Writing and Reading Center (Links to an external site.)</u> is a great place to get extra help! You will be required to meet with a tutor in the WRC for the third draft of your essays. I recommend that you meet with a tutor more often to help you with any of the reading and writing we do in class.
