

Syllabus to History 17A-54Z, Winter 2023

Description: United States civilization to 1815. A survey of the United States (history; political, economic, intellectual and social development).

• **Student Learning Outcomes:** Students will demonstrate and apply knowledge of United States History to 1815 primary documents to construct defensible statements of meaning and evaluation about this period's developments.

Students will identify, critically evaluate, and interpret United States from pre-historic and colonial eras through 1815 primary documents to construct historical analysis.

Requirements

1) Be prepared to spend 12 or more hours per week to use and study course materials. Read and study the text and other assigned materials as required.

2) This course section uses “**LaunchPad**” as our required electronic course management system, and students must purchase access to LaunchPad. You will access LaunchPad for our course on De Anza Online Education’s Canvas system under “Macmillan Learning.” All exams and other graded work will be taken online in LaunchPad.

Purchase the following items through the De Anza College Bookstore or by one of the other options for obtaining them explained below.

You must buy access to **LaunchPad**, our course’s required Course Management System.

You may either buy access to LaunchPad combined with a print version of *The American Promise* textbook at our Book Store (option 1 below), or you may buy LaunchPad access alone from Macmillan on our course's Canvas site (option 2) with no print book and exclusively use the e-book *The American Promise* that is automatically on LaunchPad.

Buy Option 1 Or Option 2, but Not Both.

Option 1. is available for purchase only from the bookstore. Package of Roark, et al., Loose-leaf Version for *The American Promise*, Volume 1, 8th ed, Value Edition, combined with access to LaunchPad for *The American Promise*, 8 ed.

If you purchase this textbook with LaunchPad package from the bookstore, please note that the access code for LaunchPad is located on the **inside front cover** of your loose-leaf package. You will need to scratch off the code and enter it into your Launchpad course on our Canvas website. Important: Do NOT buy a used copy of this package, even though a used option is given on the bookstore's web site, because no used copy of the book will contain LaunchPad Access.

Option 2. LaunchPad for Roark, et. al, *The American Promise*, 8th edition, Combined Volume (6-month access). As this option comes with no print textbook, you will use only the e-book of *The American Promise* on LaunchPad.

Also, note that this purchase option is NOT available through the Book store but only through the Macmillan Learning feature on our course's Canvas site. The earliest you can get on our course's Canvas site is on Thursday, Jan. 5.

3. Buy, or otherwise acquire, *The Interesting Narrative of the Life of Olaudah Equiano, Written by Himself*. The bookstore order for it allows you to buy it new or used in paper or to buy or rent it as an e-book. You can also use any version of this book that you find, including some that are free on the internet.

Paper copies of *The Interesting Narrative of the Life of Olaudah Equiano* are also available for free checkout to students from Academic Course Reserves in the De Anza College Library [<https://www.deanza.edu/library/index.html>].

FYI, **Course Reserves** also has hard copies of *The American Promise* 8th Value Edition available for students to check out.

How to connect to LaunchPad through Canvas:

However you purchase LaunchPad, you must **go through Canvas the very first time you get onto LaunchPad**. As **Thursday January 5, 2023**, this online course Hist 17A-54Z goes live on the De Anza Canvas site for all registered students. Once you get onto our course's Canvas site, click on **Macmillan Learning** on the left and follow its directions to connect your Canvas account with LaunchPad. You will be prompted to enter the LaunchPad access code that you purchased from the bookstore or can buy LaunchPad access here directly from Macmillan.

There will be 10 Learning Curve Assignments, each based on an assigned textbook chapter, worth 10 points each.

There will be 3 EXAMS, worth 60 points each. Each Exam will cover only the reading and other course materials assigned for its portion and will not cover material previously covered by an exam. No Exam, including the Final is cumulative.

There is an ESSAY for 60 points based on the *The Interesting Narrative of the Life of Olaudah Equiano* book.

There will be 4 Discussion Board Activities, worth a total 35 points.

Quizzes and exams are available for taking on LaunchPad up until their due dates but not after. Only one graded assignment over the course of the quarter can be made up after its due date, so I strongly advise students NOT to delay taking a quiz or exam to take one (just *one*) late graded assignment.

Grading

Grades will be based on students' total points. Course letter grades will be assigned by students' performances relative to one another. All graded work is performed online on LaunchPad, our course's electronic management system.
