Course Description:- This course is an introduction of Hindi language.

.Reading, writing, speaking and listening of Hindi will be introduced and practiced within cultural framework.

Demonstrate competency in reading and writing simple sentences. Also develop an ability to speak and listen to common everyday Hindi. Demonstrate understanding of subtleties related to Indian culture and customs.

SLO 1

Understanding of grammar of the Hindi language. Ability to parse sentences into Nouns, Pronouns, Verbs, Adverbs and Adjectives. Rules and practices of gender and tenses. Singular and inflections of plurality.

SLO 2

Ability to converse reasonably fluently in everyday Hindi. Ability to exchange greetings, discuss the weather, order in a restaurant, make travel arrangements and make purchases.

SLO 3

Participate in appropriate group discussions. Also ability to read, and write short stories. Develop a ‘sense and flavor’ of the language. Count up to seventy.

SLO 4

Develop a familiarity with Indian culture. This includes Indian festivals, Indian customs, Indian foods and other aspects of everyday life in India.
