◆ Welcome to ESL 251/451

This course will help you improve your English communication skills so that you can be more successful academically, professionally, and personally. In this class, we will work on listening, speaking, vocabulary and presentation skills. We will be working on our textbook, in-class and out of class assignments to enhance your listening and speaking skills. You can expect up to 6 hours of homework every week, so be sure to make enough time in your schedule to complete the assignments.

◆ Student Learning Outcomes

Produce comprehensible high-intermediate spoken English through one-on-one, group, and public speaking situations on academic topics.

Demonstrate listening comprehension of a variety of high-intermediate listening materials, including academic lectures, newscasts, interviews and dialogues by taking notes and answering questions.

Prerequisites

ESL 244 or ESL 444 or a qualifying score on the English as a Second Language Placement Test.

We will have several quizzes in this class, both announced and unannounced, so please do your homework and come to class prepared! Quizzes, midterm and final will be given for the purpose of checking your progress of vocabulary acquisition, pronunciation, and listening skills.

◆ Attendance & Punctuality

Attendance is crucial in this class. You must come **on time** to every class. If you come late or miss class, it will affect your participation points and lower your final grade. You are allowed a **total** of two absences (excused and unexcused) in this class. If you miss more than two classes, you may be dropped from the class. If you do miss a class, it is your responsibility to contact a classmate, get the assignments for the following day and come to class prepared. Please do not email the instructor to ask for the homework.

◆Listening and Speaking Workshops

The Listening and Speaking Center at De Anza (AT 313) offers several workshops weekly. The topics include pronunciation, presentation skills, cultural assimilation, discussions, video discussion, etc. You are required to attend at least 4 workshops during the entire quarter. You will write a report for **each workshop** attended and have the workshop leader sign your reports. Two (2) workshops will be turned in on the day of the

midterm exam and an additional two will be submitted on the day of the final exam. Please do not attend GRAMMAR workshops for this class.

Presentations

You will deliver two formal oral presentations this quarter:

- 1. A recorded individual presentation (part of Midterm Exam)
- 2. An in-class final presentation (part of Final Exam)

◆Pronunciation Assessment

You will record yourself a script that the instructor will provide you. You will then submit your recording on Canvas. The instructor will listen to it and make suggestions on how to improve your pronunciation.
